








# Finding Partners and Securing their Support for Senior High School

#### **INDUSTRY DIALOGUES**

- The **Industry Dialogue** is spearheaded by the Local Executive Department, through the *Technical Education, Skills Development and Employment Committee* (TESDEC);
- The **Industry Dialogue** is a series of roundtable discussions between the City Government and Local Industries, as stakeholders, providing a venue for discourse on existing concerns, labor market demands, solutions and potential partnerships between the public and private sectors.



#### **INDUSTRY SURVEY**

- An Industry Survey was conducted through the collaborative effort of the City Government, the DepEd Division Office, and Xavier University (Academe), with the support of Synergeia Foundation, Inc. and the League of Cities of the Philippines (LCP);
- The survey was designed as an industry mapping and analysis tool supplying relevant data in relation to industry skills and employment market and demand, and guiding in the selection of course offerings based on industry needs and potential employability.


## SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP
