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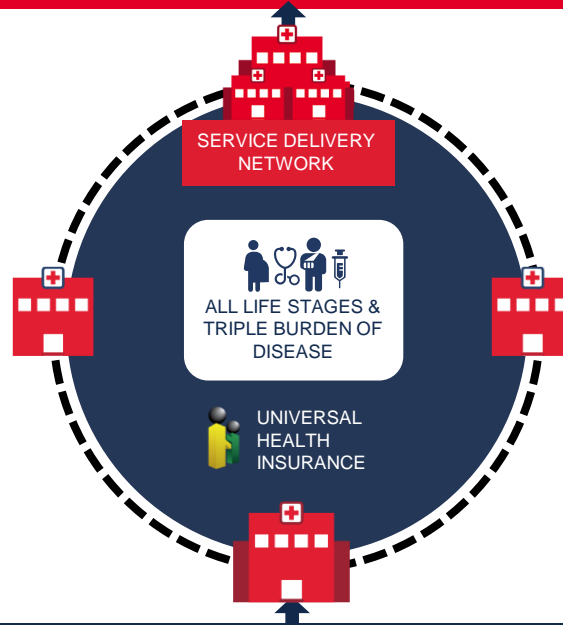

DEVELOPMENT OF MODEL PROGRAMS

- “Community-Based Treatment and Care Services for People Affected with Drug Use and Drug Dependence in the Philippines” – the guidance manual has already been developed with funding assistance from the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC); Barangay health workers and other community health providers/volunteers are empowered and mobilized in the prevention and control of drug abuse; Four target pilot areas for the implementation this year(2016): one each in the National Capital Region, Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.
- “One-Stop Shop Admission in TRCs”: This is currently being done at DOH-TRC Bicutan as a pilot mechanism in facilitating easier access/ admission process for the drug dependents.

On Specific Health Indicators

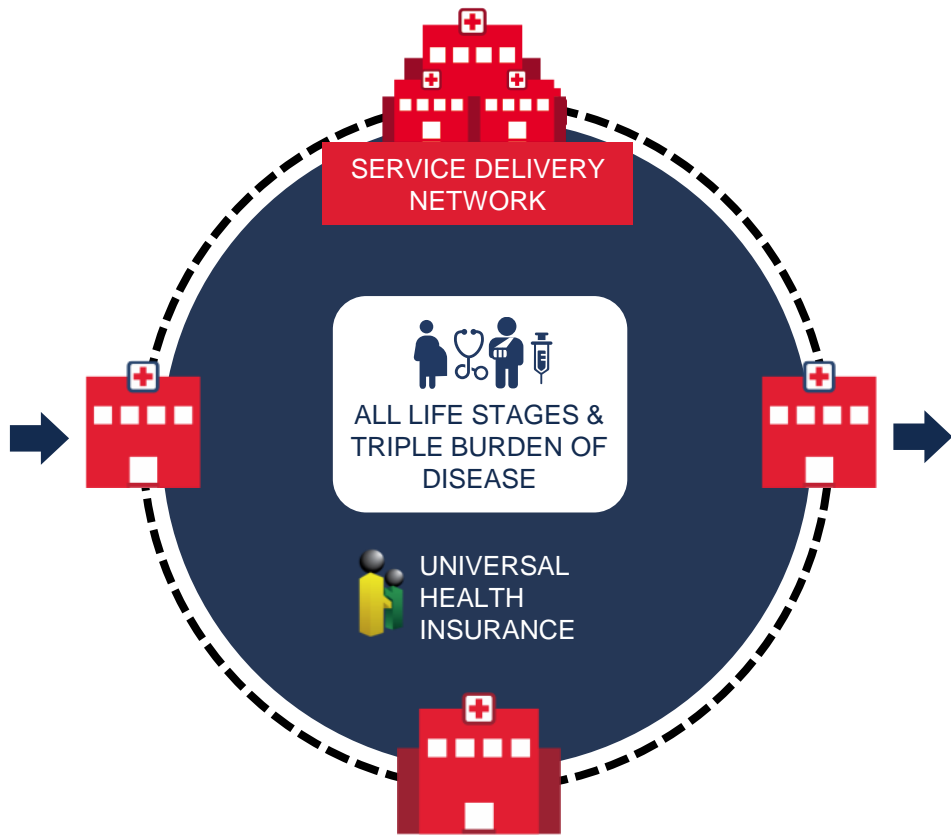
- Focus on all life stages and triple burden of diseases
- National Immunization Program – example: % of Fully Immunized Children
- Women, Men and Children’s Health Development Program – example: Maternal Mortality Rate
- Infectious Diseases Program – example: Number of malaria and rabies-free areas
- Lifestyle Related and Non Communicable Diseases Program – example: Number of Hypertensives and Diabetics registered
- Human Resource for Health Program – Number of human resources deployed by profession (doctors, nurse, midwives, and others)

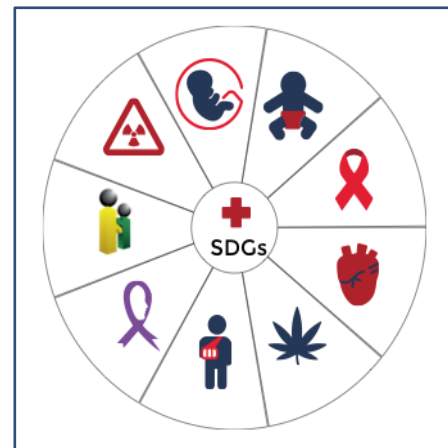
- HFEP
