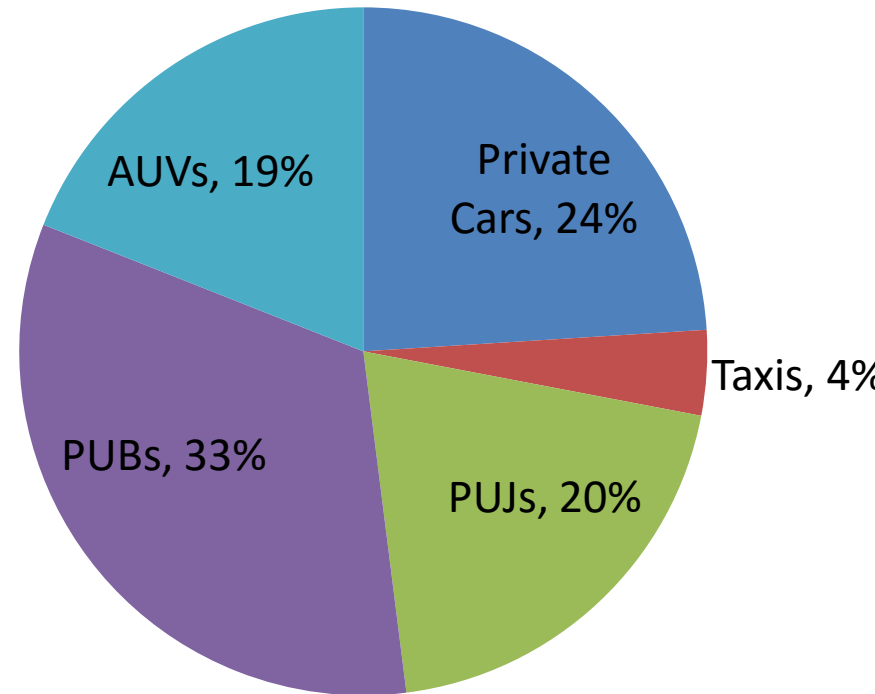


Peak Hour Data of EDSA

Volume of Vehicles per type



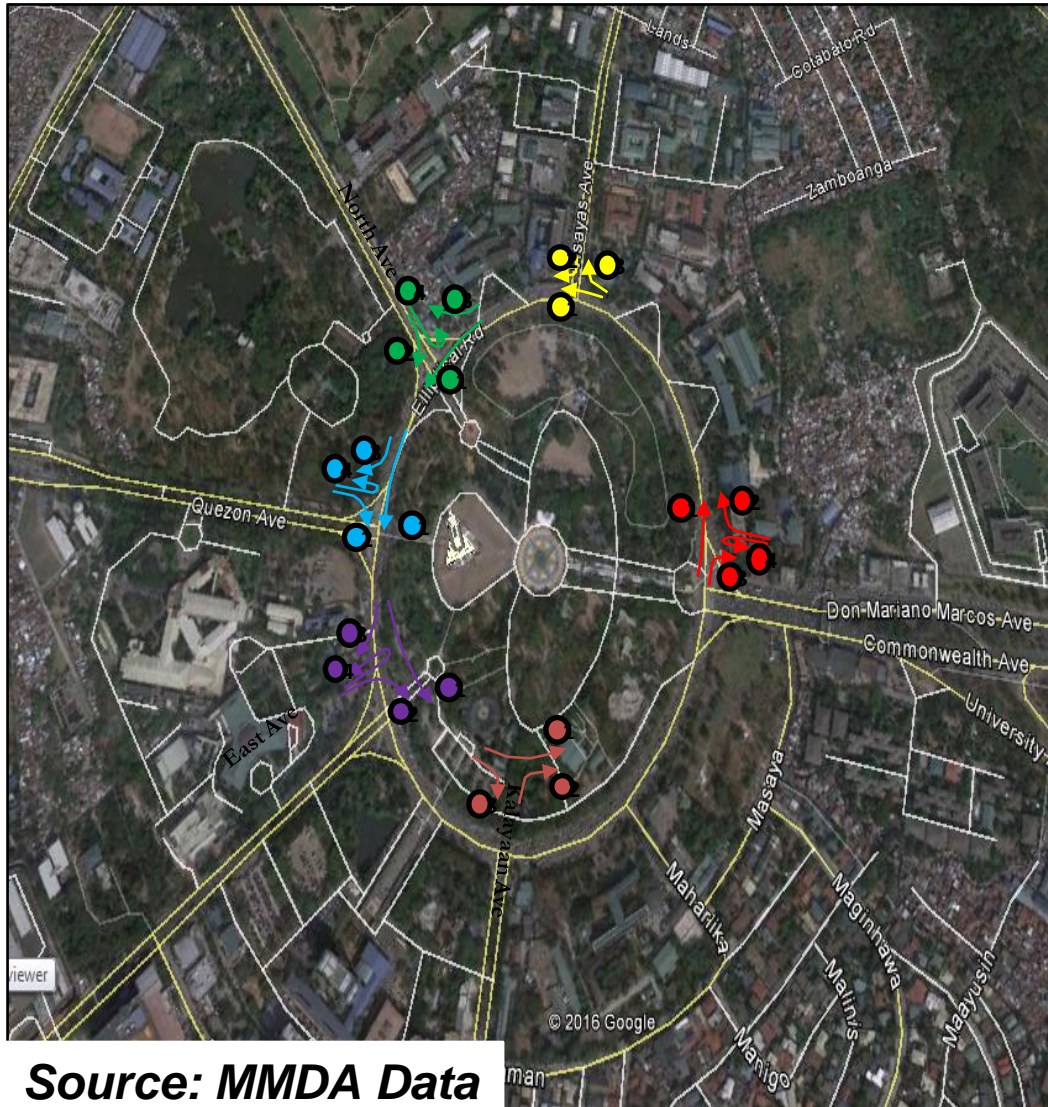
Passengers Carried per vehicle type

- ❖ **From SM Sta. Mesa to SM North EDSA:** Along Araneta Ave., right to Del Monte, left at Roosevelt, right at Baler, left at Miller Ave., right at Calumpit, left at Bansalangin, right at EDSA to SM North EDSA and vice versa.
- ❖ **From Trinoma to SM Marikina:** Along North Ave., QMC, right at Kalayaan Ave., left at V. Luna, right at Anonas, left at Chico, Xavierville Ave., right at Katipunan, U-turn at Aurora Blvd., Marcos Highway to SM Marikina and vice versa.

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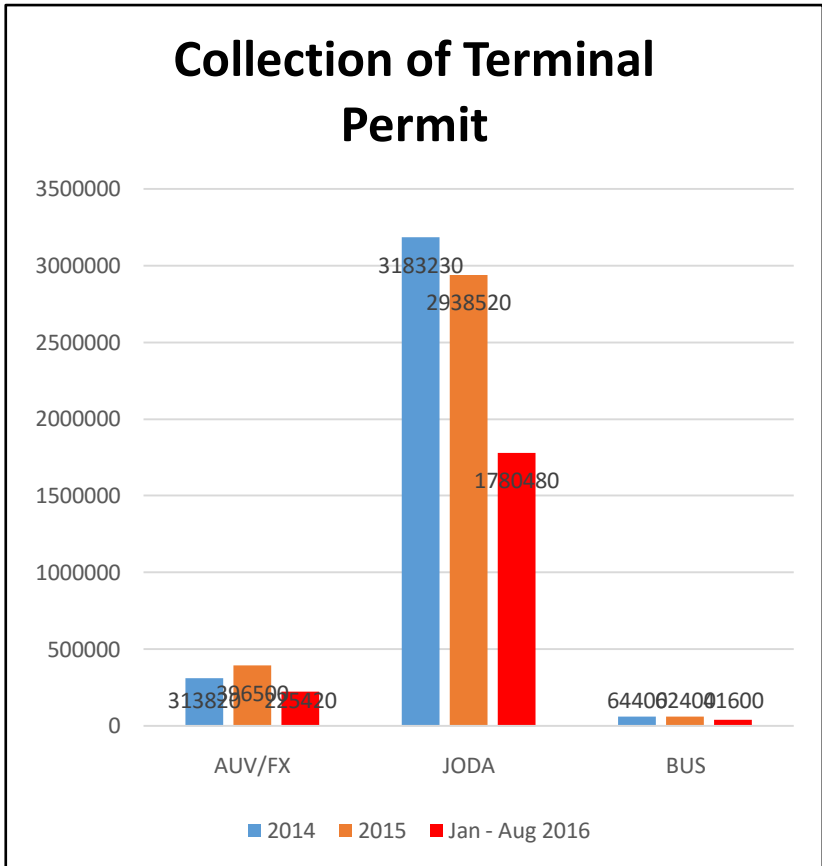

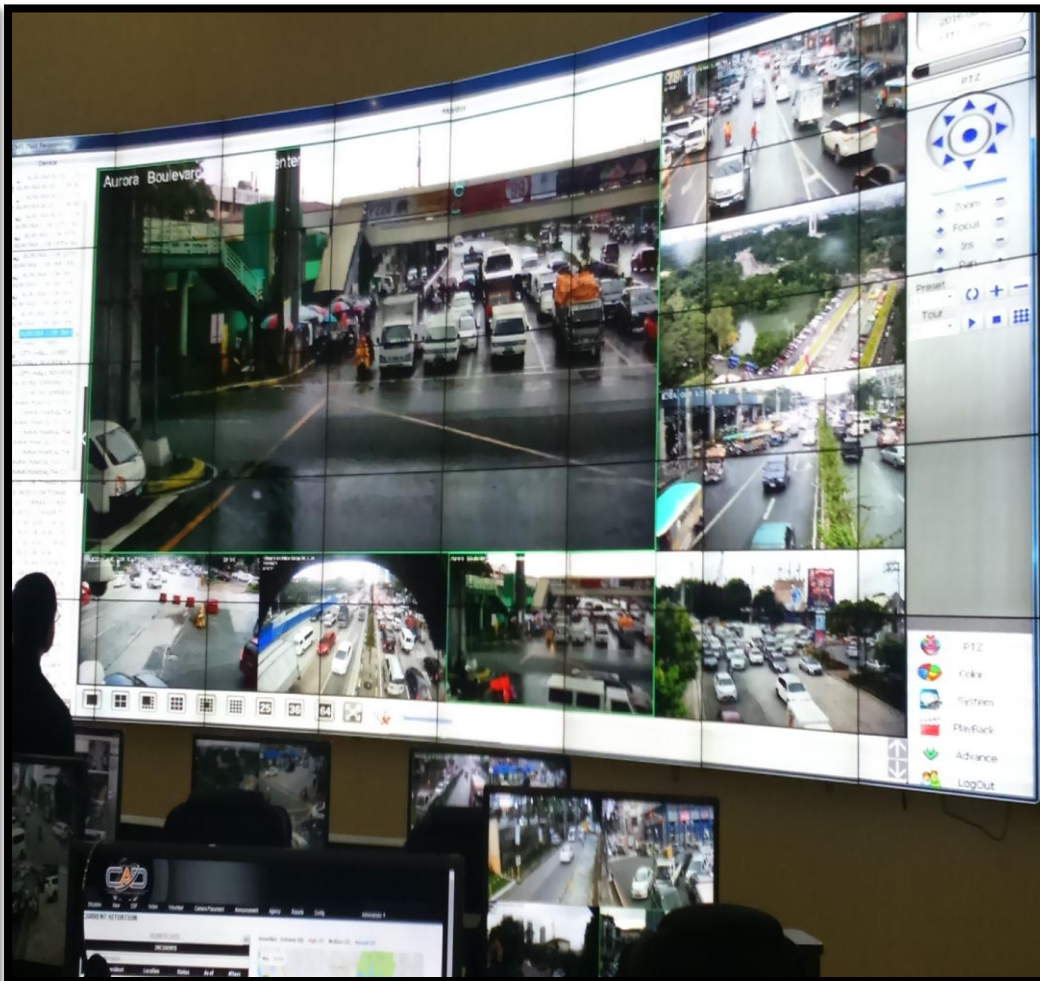
